Craft Aims

REVIEW the Bible Stories.
EXPLAIN that God blesses us richly.
EXPLORE how to use our blessings for
God's glory.

Materials

Bible Review Story Wheel (Wheel Cover and Story Art) reproducible pages
cardstock
scissors
glue
glitter or sand
glitter pens
crayons or markers
stickers, sequins, and other decorations
brad paper fasteners

Preparation

Make copies of the **Bible Review Story Wheel (Wheel Cover and Story Art)** reproducible pages onto cardstock, one per student. Cut out the Wheel Cover and Story Art. When you cut out the window in the **Wheel Cover**, make sure to only cut along the dotted lines, leaving the small circle in the center of the Wheel Cover intact.

Directions for Students

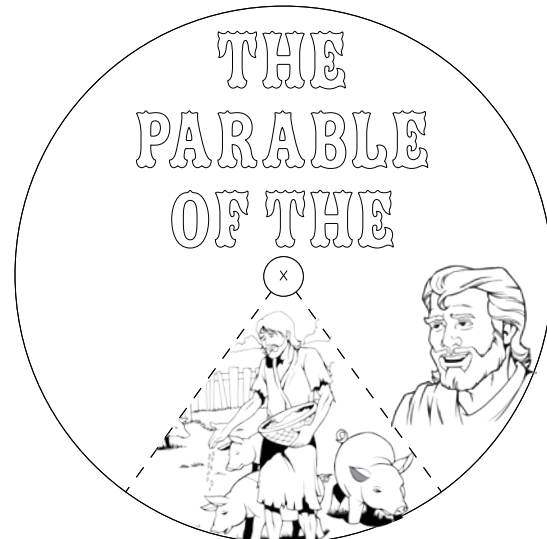
- ★ Spread glue on the letters of "The Parable of the" on the Wheel Cover.
- ★ Sprinkle glitter over the glue, then gently tap off the extra glitter.
- ★ While the glue dries, use markers or crayons to color in the pictures on the Story Art.
- ★ Color the Jesus picture on the Wheel Cover.
- ★ Decorate the **Wheel Cover** with stickers and other decorative items.

Directions for Teacher

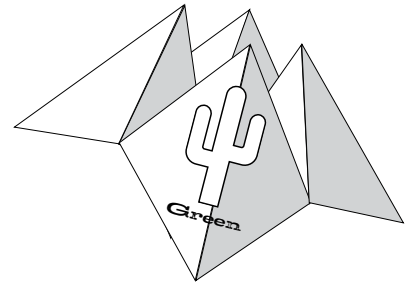
- ★ Help students line up the Wheel Cover and Story Art wheels, and push a brad through the center X.
- ★ Spread the brad open, and show them how to line the Story Art up in the window of the Wheel Cover.

Scripture Catcher



Theme Verse:

Craft Aims

REVIEW the VBS Bible Verses.

EXPLAIN that we should catch God's Word and hide it in our hearts.

EXPLORE ways to memorize God's Word.

Materials

Scripture Catcher reproducible page
paper
scissors
crayons or markers

Preparation

Make copies of the **Scripture Catcher** reproducible page onto paper, one per student. Cut out the Scripture Catcher. Keep the images at the top of the page for students to use as a guide as they create their Scripture Catcher.

Directions for Students

- ★ Color the small images of the barn, star, cactus, and boot the color that is listed below them.
- ★ Fold the paper in half so that the printed side is to the inside. Open the paper, then fold in half again, the opposite direction.
- ★ Lay paper on a flat surface, printed-side down. Grasp one corner and fold it in, aligning the corner with the crease in the center of the square. (See image 1.) Repeat with the other four corners. (See image 2.)
- ★ Turn the paper over, Scripture side up. Grasp one corner and fold it in, aligning the corner with the crease in the center of the square. (See image 3.) Repeat with the other four corners.
- ★ Fold the square in half to make a rectangle. (See image 4.) Slide a finger under each flap and gently pull up to make a pocket for your fingers. Slide a thumb and fore finger into each pocket.

To Catch God's Scripture

- ★ Slide forefingers and thumbs in the pockets of the Scripture Catcher. Ask a friend to pick one of the colors.
- ★ Open the catcher in one direction and then the opposite, pinching thumbs and forefingers together, once for each letter in the color word. When you stop, hold the catcher where your friend can see. Have them pick one of the Lesson Focus words.
- ★ Spell out the Lesson Focus word, opening and shutting the catcher with each letter. Have your friend pick another Focus Word. Gently lift the flap to read the Scripture underneath.

Ask:

- ★ Is that a theme verse, lesson memory verse, or a new verse?
- ★ Of which lesson was that verse the memory verse?
- ★ To which Bible story did that verse apply?
- ★ Can you repeat the verse without looking at the catcher?
