

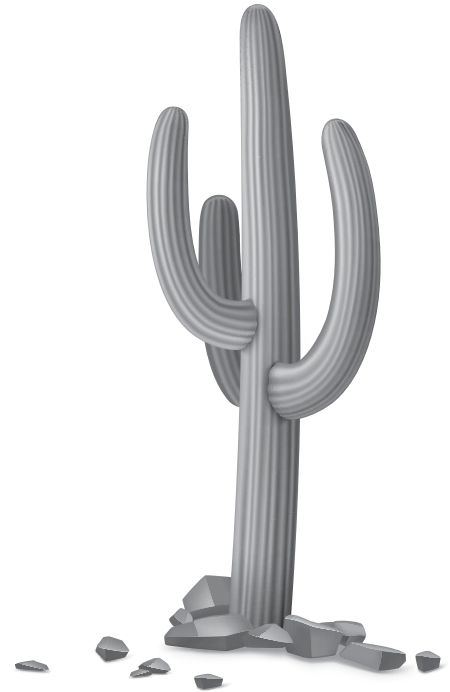
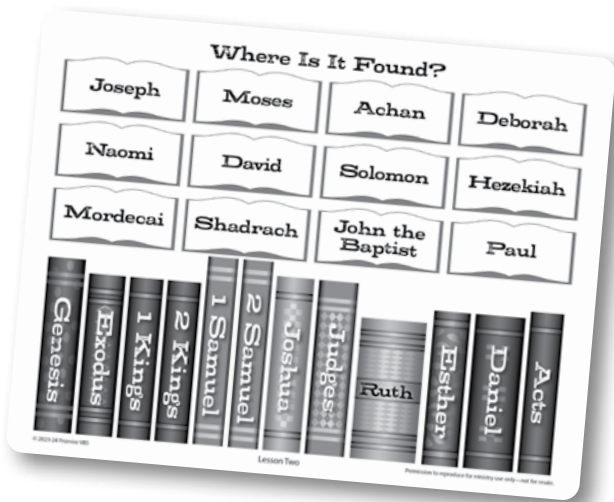
Where Is It Found?

Materials needed: Visual Aid marked Lesson Two—Where Is It Found? reproducible Bibles

Before class, remove the “Where Is It Found” reproducible from the Visual Aid packet. Make several copies, one for every two to three students. Cut the visuals into pieces, and keep each set of pieces separate. Like the previous activity, this game helps the students gain Bible knowledge and gives them practice looking up Scripture.

Divide the students into teams of two to three. Place one set of pieces face-down in front of each team. SAY: **Your goal is to match the name of a Bible character to the book that best tells of his or her life. You can use your Bibles to complete the puzzle.** Upon the word, “Go,” each team should begin trying to match their Bible characters to the appropriate books. When they believe they have successfully completed the task, they should raise their hands. If they are correct, they win. If they are incorrect, do not tell them which matches were incorrect. Simply say, “No, try again.” The correct matches are found to the right.
