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# Who is God? Wheel

### Theme verse:

For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope.

# materials

Who Is God? Wheel Cover and Who Is God? Wheel reproducible pages

white cardstock

scissors

glue

glitter or sand

glitter pens

crayons and markers

stickers, sequins, and other decorations brad paper fasteners



# **Preparation**

Copy the **Who Is God? Wheel Cover** and **Who Is God? Wheel** reproducible pages onto white cardstock, 1 set per student. When you cut out the window in the *Wheel Cover*, make sure to only cut along the dotted lines, leaving the small circle in the center of the *Wheel Cover* intact.

# Directions for Students

- 1. Spread glue inside the letters on the *Wheel Cover*. Sprinkle glitter or sand on the letters. Gently tap to remove the excess.
- 2. While the glue dries, use markers or crayons to color in the words and pictures on the *Who Is God? Wheel*.
- 3. Color the pictures of the animals on the Wheel Cover
- 4. Decorate the *Wheel Cover* with stickers and other decorative items.

# Directions for Teachers

- 1. Help students line up the Who is God? Wheel Cover and Who is God? Wheel, and push a brad through the center X.
- 2. Spread the brad open, and show them how to line up the words in the window of the *Wheel Cover*.



# Butterfly Note Holder

# Theme verse:

# materials

# "Don't Frog-et" Reminder Note

reproducible page
white cardstock
scissors
glue and tape
plastic table cover
coffee filters
washable markers
spray bottle
chenille stems
beads
clothes pins
adhesive magnetic strips
Optional—cotton swabs

# **Preparation**

Copy the "Don't Frog-et" Reminder Note reproducible page onto white cardstock, and cut out. Cover your tables with plastic table coverings.

# TiDS

Use a cotton swab to encourage the wet colors to blend.

Use the clothes pin to hold your first folded filter closed as you fold the second filter. You can also use the clothes pin to hold both as you twist the chenille stem around them.

For added stability, use a hot glue gun to help students glue their butterfly to the clothes pin.

# Step 1

- 1. Flatten out a coffee filter. Use washable markers to color a pattern on the filter. (Your colors will be bleeding together, so remember! Yellow and blue make green. Blue and red make purple. Red and yellow make orange.) Draw a similar pattern on the second coffee filter.
- Lightly mist the coffee filters with a spray bottle, just enough to wet the colors so they run together slightly, but not so much that they become muddy. Allow the filters to dry completely before moving on to the next step. (Use a fan to speed the process. Don't forget to weigh the butterfly down so it doesn't fly away!)

# Step a

- 1. Fan fold (pleat) one coffee filter. Repeat with the second coffee filter. Stack the two folded coffee filters on top of each other.
- 2. Fold a chenille stem in half. Place the folded and stacked coffee filters between the two halves of the chenille stem. (Remember, you folds will need to open up to create the wings. Make sure the filters are facing the correct direction.)
- 3. Twist the chenille stem just below the filters. Then twist the stem just above the filters. This will tightly pinch the filters between the chenille stem.
- Just above the twist in the stem above the filters, leave a ½-inch loop in the stem, and twist again. This will form the butterfly head. Spread the ends of the stem out to form the antennae.
- 5. Carefully open and spread the coffee filters to form the wings of the butterfly. Pinch at the ends to retain the folds. Gently tuck the wings behind the chenille stem body.
- 6. Thread a bead onto the end of each chenille stem and crimp the ends to hold the beads in place.
- 7. Glue the butterfly to a clothespin.
- 8. Attach a piece of adhesive magnetic strip to the back of the clothes pin.
- 9. Give each student several "Don't Frog-et" Reminder Notes to color and use at home with their *Butterfly Note Holder*.
